NEF remains fully committed to helping our schools going forward - and we are more grateful then ever for such a strong and supportive community.

The Northampton Education Foundation concluded our Endowment campaign on Dec. 31, 2019, topping our \$1 million goal for a total of \$1,064,597 gifted and pledged to the NEF Endowment Fund. With the success of this campaign, the NEF Endowment will fund larger, multi-year grants to all Northampton schools forever, solely from the interest on the Endowment.

This campaign attracted widespread support from local banks, businesses and institutions, as well as many families with children in the schools, alumni and individual community members who join in recognizing the long-term value of a vibrant public education system. Since its inception in 2002, the Endowment has now raised more than \$2 million.

In these extraordinary times of school closings and the shuttering of many community centers and businesses, our daily life has been upended. Despite the ever-changing nature of life right now, the Northampton Education Foundation remains steadfast in its support of the needs of the Northampton Public Schools. Our regular 2020 fundraisers have been canceled or postponed. We remain deeply grateful for the generosity of the community in our past fundraisers; it is that generosity that enables us to meet some of the immediate needs of our learning community today, as well as plan for a time when students and staff can come together again.

Why I Give:

Dr. Melvin Hershkowitz honors his daughter's memory - and her legacy as an educator - with named fund

At 97, Melvin Hershkowitz has made educationally focused philanthropy into his own cottage industry. And while it has much to do with the untimely loss of his beloved daughter, Marie, there is much more to the story....

A spry and sharp-witted resident of Northampton since 2010, Hershkowitz has shared his good fortune generously with institutions like his alma mater Columbia University, Hampshire College, Bridge Street School, and most recently, the NEF Endowment Fund.

Education figured heavily in his New York City upbringing. His father was among the first board certified ENT surgeons in the country in 1921, and so medicine seemed the logical option for Melvin early on. At NYC's Horace Mann Prep School, he excelled at German, finishing his time there with an unbroken string of perfect test scores. He continued his German studies as a pre-med student at Columbia, garnering the Deutsche Verein prize at graduation. So it should surprise no one that as a newly minted M.D. eager to incorporate his language skills in a post-war military deployment, he was immediately dispatched to Japan. There, he recalls, he spent most of his time treating American G.I.'s for STDs.

Back in New York after his stint in the Army, Hershkowitz was at first drawn to a career in pathology, but "after some 20 autopsies, I realized that I would rather work on live patients." Twenty years in a private Manhattan practice followed, along with a marriage to Joanna Lega and three children, including the youngest, Marie. Melvin always managed to keep one foot firmly planted in academia, acting as a teaching fellow at NYU, and eventually moving into a more full-time teaching position at the New Jersey Medical School. Later he taught at George Washington University and then, at the age of 67, he was invited onto the faculty of Brown University's medical school, where he remained until his retirement – "for real this time" – at 81.

Not long after that, Melvin found his way to Northampton, where his daughter Marie had settled with her husband, Steve. Marie had graduated from Hampshire College and decided to stay in the area, taking on a number of teaching positions before landing at Bridge Street School as an ESP with a keen interest in special education.

She was a beloved teacher who organized early morning study groups and maintained a special library for her SPED students. She twice won awards for her work in this field. Melvin describes her as being incredibly devoted to the children at Bridge Street and having "a universal compassion streak." He remembers her as always having had something positive to share about her students.

Tragically, in 2013 Marie Hershkowitz succumbed to brain cancer and was deeply mourned by all whose lives she had touched. Her father set about honoring her memory, first with a scholarship in her name at Hampshire College, then by contributing to a new playground at Bridge Street, and finally with a named fund in her honor within the NEF Endowment Fund.

"I've had good fortune and it's important to share that," he says. "Marie was a brilliant teacher. Students need to see that you really care about them and that you can guide them when they encounter difficulties. That's what made Marie such a good teacher. It's not just about the transmission of information. I am blessed to be able to honor her memory and support something that meant so much to her."

NEF Endowment grants at work: Breakfast After the Bell

The NEF Endowment provided seed money in 2019 for a local pilot program of Breakfast After the Bell. This program provides a healthy morning meal to all children regardless of family income, increasing breakfast participation and removing stigma lower-income students often face when they eat breakfast at school. Benefits include improved academic achievement, improved student health and increased attendance rates.

This highly successful program, which will receive federal funding, will roll out in all Northampton elementary schools in Fall 2020.

This grant reflects the NEF Endowment's goals of promoting innovation, collaboration and sustainability.



What's next for the NEF Endowment: A new cycle of larger, collaborative grants - forever

With the success of the NEF Endowment campaign, we are excited to launch a new, ongoing, 3-year grant cycle for large-scale, collaborative projects that will impact all Northampton public school students. Thanks to this expanded Endowment, NEF will generate approximately \$100,000 per year for our city's schools. Our city's educators will have more time to dream big and plan accordingly, and to collaborate more effectively among schools.

In response to the pandemic, the NPS district has stepped up to ensure the security of staff pay and benefits, as well as to meet the needs of our more vulnerable community members with daily food distributions. As the school district works to provide resources to families and explore options for distance learning, NEF is proactively reaching out to teachers and administrators to determine how we may support them in this crisis.

With the current uncertainty, we are working out the timeline of the new Endowment grant cycle, and hope to begin grant distribution as soon as the 2022-2023 school year. We are planning the details of the new grant process to include the voices of faculty, staff, students, School Council, PTOs and community members. Final decisions for Endowment grants will be made by the NEF Board with the recommendations of the Endowment distribution committee. The twice-yearly Small Grants to Teachers and the NEF/SOS Book Fund will continue unchanged, and annual Endowment grants will continue as before until the new grant cycle commences.

In an order to be determined, the plan for the new annual grant cycle is:

NEF awards grant to Northampton High School to use over 3 years

NEF awards grant to JFK Middle School to use over 3 years

NEF awards grant to all four elementary schools to use over 3 years

With the success of this Endowment campaign, this cycle will continue in perpetuity. Each school (or school level in the case of the elementary schools) will have a larger amount of grant money with which to plan over the three years. Grants are intended to foster innovative and creative projects, and a percentage of each Endowment grant cycle will be allocated to sustain proven projects.

Money given to the Endowment is not spent, but rather carefully invested through the Community Foundation of Western Massachusetts. These larger grants are generated from the interest of these investments. Gifts, pledges and bequests from local parents, alumni, community members, and businesses become an educational legacy.

With a strong NEF Endowment, teachers will have the resources to promise a first-class educational experience, regardless of the economic or political climate. Public education in Northampton will thrive, and our students will be prepared for the world ahead.

Thanks to your support, the NEF Endowment is poised to expand its grantmaking and its commitment to Northampton's public school students and teachers.

With the backing of our community, the Endowment will continue to grow.
