NEF HIGHLIGHTS 2019 - 2020 School Year

- Thanks to all of you, the 2018-2019 Small Grants to Teachers Program awarded \$52,112 to fund 19 projects. This money was raised through our Annual Appeal and the Northampton Adult Spelling Bee.
- This year, the Support Our Schools Book Fund awarded \$20,533 to Northampton's schools to purchase books and educational materials.
- The Daniel Stephen Goldstein

Dear Friends and Neighbors,

Great news—thanks to your generous support, we have raised over 75% of our Endowment goal of a million dollars, ensuring that the NEF continues to empower educators and create meaningful impact in our schools. We're making real, positive change—and you're part of it!

It's hard to concentrate in school if you haven't eaten, so this year a NEF Endowment Grant is funding Breakfast After the Bell at Bridge Street and Ryan Road Schools. Families who qualify for free/reduced lunch also qualify for free breakfast, which has traditionally been served before school, when children naturally prefer playing with their friends. This grant provides all students with a free breakfast that is served after the first bell. We're so proud that our community is pioneering equity in the schools.

Live STEAM provides the foundation for a course on production management and sound recording in the theater program at NHS. This intersection between art, technology, and engineering will take our high school productions to the next level, giving students skills in the complexities and opportunities of new technology.


Endowment Grants are just one piece of what we do. We also fund classroom grants and libraries for every school in the district.

Breakfast After the Bell: Bridge St and RKFRR Schools: Many students have hectic morning schedules or sense the stigma around school breakfast. Breakfast After the Bell models break barriers and increase participation, providing a greater percentage of students with one of the most important ways to start their day- a healthy breakfast.

Grow Food Kids: All elementary schools: This ongoing project helps students develop positive relationships with food by teaching basic cooking skills, nutrition, and a deeper understanding of where food comes from. Grow Food offers hands-on experiences to students at each of the four Northampton elementary schools in the classroom and on field trips to Crimson & Clover Farm and our Community Garden and Giving Garden.

Live Steam: NHS: Students in the performing arts programs will be exposed to and master the advanced technologies used in their disciplines and will be introduced to popular forms of expression which exist outside traditional instrumental, vocal and theatrical curricula. Two courses will be developed in this 3-year program. Music Technology and Sound Recording will teach students musical composition and recording. On the Theater and Film side, Production Management will provide guidance and training to sound engineers, lighting designers, stage managers and producers for live performances.

Sojourner's Truth in the 21st Century: The new 5th grade state standards include Sojourner Truth and other abolitionists in the "Slavery and Legacy of Civil War and Struggle for Civil Rights". This grant will provide teachers with the necessary support to continue to develop a 5th grade model social studies unit for the district.






